




## Plastic Film and Bag Recycling Offered to Businesses



The Dunn County Solid Waste Division has been selected to participate in a pilot program that will recycle plastic film and bags from local businesses and the industrial sector. The recycling program, named Wisconsin W.R.A.P. (Wrap Recycling Action Program)—Recycling Plastic Film Beyond Bags, includes stretch wrap, pallet wrap, furniture wrap, retail bags and more. The program has been made possible through the coordination of both local and national organizations including the American Chemistry Council, Flexible Film Recycling, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Indianhead Enterprises, Inc. and Trex Company, Inc. A drop-off for plastic film and bags from businesses and the industrial sector will be located at Indianhead Enterprises, Inc. in Menomonie. Businesses interested in participating in the program should contact the Dunn County Solid Waste Division at 715-232-4017.

Plastic film and bags from residents are currently being collected at the Dunn County Transfer Station and Recycling Center, Area Collection Stations, Marketplace Foods and Walmart. Plastic film includes retail bags, produce bags, bread bags, newspaper bags, case wrap, dry cleaning bags, air pillows used in shipping and plastic packaging around napkins, paper towels and bathroom tissue. ## Recycle clean, dry plastic bags and film packaging

The Dunn County Solid Waste Division has been selected to participate in a pilot program that will recycle plastic film and bags from local businesses and the industrial sector. The recycling program, named Wisconsin W.R.A.P. (Wrap Recycling Action Program)—Recycling Plastic Film Beyond Bags, includes clean and dry stretch wrap, pallet wrap, furniture wrap, retail bags and more.

Collected plastic bags and film will benefit Indianhead Enterprises, a not-for-profit rehabilitation facility and vocational center for individuals with disabilities and other barriers to employment. Workers like Charlie Brown, pictured on the right, assist with unloading plastic and running the baler.

Indianhead Enterprises is working in collaboration with Trex®, who will buy the material and make plastic lumber out of the material.

Businesses interested in participating in the program should contact the Dunn County Solid Waste Division at 715-232-4017 to set up a site visit to determine what can be recycled.



### Recyclable Plastic Film

Common commercial or industrial use examples include:

- Case, shrink and pallet (stretch film) wraps
- Film and bags designed to protect or transport merchandise
- Furniture and electronics wraps
- Industrial use film and bags designed to protect or transport materials
- Bubble wrap and air packets (shipping)
- Grocery, retail and newspaper bags
- Dry cleaning bags
- Consumer product packaging (bathroom tissue, paper towels and bulk item case wrap)
- Zipper type food storage bags and bread bags


