**Notice of Final Determination to Reissue Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES)
General Construction Storm Water Discharge Permit, September 2016**

Construction Storm Water Discharge Permit, WPDES General Permit No. WI-S067831-5: This general permit covers storm water discharges associated with land disturbing construction activity. This general permit applies to dischargers throughout Wisconsin meeting the criteria for coverage.

The general permit applies to new and existing storm water discharges to waters of the state throughout Wisconsin and is issued under the statutory authority granted to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (Department) pursuant to ss. 283.33 (storm water discharge permits) and 283.35 (general permits), Wis. Stats.

Pursuant to ss. 203.12 and 205.08(10)(e), Wis. Adm. Code, the Department has made a final determination to reissue the general permit. The general permit is reissued and effective October 1, 2016, and expires on September 30, 2021. APPEAL RIGHTS

To challenge the reasonableness of or necessity for any term or condition of the general permit, Wis. Stat. s. 283.63 and ch. NR 203, Wis. Adm. Code, state that any permit applicant, permittee, affected state, or 5 or more persons may file a verified petition for review with the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources within 60 days after the Department issues notice of the permit decision.

Section 283.35, Stats., authorizes the Department to issue a general permit for discharges from categories or classes of point sources. The Department may withdraw a facility from coverage under a general permit if it is determined that a discharge is a significant contributor of pollutants, if the discharger is not in compliance with the permit terms and conditions, if there are changes in treatment technology or new effluent standards or limitations since permit issuance, or if a permittee requests individual permit coverage.

For permit-related decisions that are not reviewable pursuant to s. 283.63, Stats., such as the decision to confer general permit coverage to a specific facility, it may be possible for a permittee or other persons to obtain an administrative review pursuant to s. 227.42, Stats., and s. NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, or judicial review pursuant to s. 227.52, Stats. If a person chooses to pursue review of a decision to grant general permit coverage to a specific facility, a petition must be filed within 30 days of the date the Department's decision to confer coverage is either mailed or otherwise served. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to ss. 227.52 and 227.53, Stats., a petition must be filed with the appropriate circuit court and be served on the Department. A petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.
