


BLACK RIVER STATE FOREST

Harvest Area: Morrison and Levis Creek Basins Forest Production Area

-  Jack Pine regeneration harvest. Cut all trees ≥ 5 " dbh except red pine. Best access into sale area is to cross Hay Creek from old landing on Bartos Road. DNR will get temporary stream crossing permit. 12 Acres (approx. 500 tons volume)
-  Oak/Pine regeneration harvest. Cut all trees ≥ 5 " dbh except red pine and 4-8 large crowned oaks per acre. Access into sale is on ATV/Snowmobile trail and will require dry or frozen conditions. Trail must be kept in useable conditions when open for public use. 31 Acres (approx. 1500 tons volume)

Parts of sale are on low ground and will require dry or frozen conditions and extra care/brushing by contractor to prevent rutting.

Purpose of Sale:

To regenerate a mixed oak and pine stand, leaving oak and red pine residual for wildlife and to regenerate a jack pine stand.

Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:

1. This sale is located mainly on dry ground, but access into both areas will require very dry or frozen ground. There are some low drainages within the sale area that should be avoided by the equipment operators during harvesting. Access into the jack pine regeneration area will also require a temporary stream crossing. The DNR Forester will file the permit, but the contractor will install and remove the actual stream crossing materials.
2. The sale boundaries are red paint lines, open wetlands and the ATV/Snowmobile trail. Do not fell trees across paint lines and do not cut painted boundary trees.
3. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to poor soil fertility.
4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15th.
5. The ATV/Snowmobile trail runs through part of this sale and must be kept in useable condition when open for public use. Any tops or slash dropped on the trail must be promptly removed to prevent safety hazards to trail users.
6. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.

General Requirements:

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
6. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
7. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
8. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.

10. **Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies – contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.**
