


BLACK RIVER STATE FOREST

**Harvest Area: Robinson Creek Basin Forest Production Area**

-  Oak/Pine regeneration harvest. Cut all trees  $\geq 2$ " dbh except 4-8 large crowned oaks per acre. Oak wilt restrictions apply to this stand - No cutting April 1-July 15.
- Part of this area (on the west end) is on low ground and will require dry or frozen conditions and extra care/brushing by contractor to prevent rutting. 45 acres.
-  White pine thinning. Cut all orange marked trees. 60 acres.

-  Section Corners
-  Woods Road
-  Purple Paint Line
-  ATV/Snowmobile Trail
-  Red Paint Line
-  Green Paint Line
-  Endangered Species Habitat - no landings or ground disturbance

**Purpose of Sale:**

To thin areas of red pine and white pine to increase tree growth and quality. To promote size growth in oak stand and discourage less desirable tree species. To regenerate pine trees through seed germination and oak trees through coppice stump sprouting.

**Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:**

1. This sale contains oak and must follow oak wilt restrictions. No cutting in the oak/pine regeneration area from April 1<sup>st</sup> to July 15<sup>th</sup>.
2. Trees to be harvested in thinning area are marked in orange paint. All trees marked must be cut. The white pine thinning stand boundaries are marked in purple to the west and south and the trail is east and northern boundary.
3. The contractor must select 4 to 8 large crowned oak trees/acre to remain uncut in the regeneration area. The western boundary of the regeneration harvest is marked with a red paint line, and the southern boundary is the woods trail.
4. The ATV trail may be used for logging from North Settlement Road to the southern sale boundary. The ATV trail north of the southern boundary is not to be used for logging activity.
5. ATV/Snowmobile trails must be kept open and in useable conditions when open for public use. Snowmobile trails cannot be plowed to bare dirt during snowmobile season.
6. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to low nutrient soils.
7. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.
8. All landings, roads and berms must be approved in advance by a DNR forester before operations begin and shall be restored to the forester's satisfaction following the harvest completion.
9. The west edge of the sale is low ground and must be harvested during dry or frozen ground conditions.

**General Requirements:**

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
6. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.

8. **Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies – contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.**
