


BLACK RIVER STATE FOREST

Jack pine clearcut. Cut all trees that are greater than 5" dbh except red pine and oak. 45 Acres.



Pine thinning - Cut all jack pine greater than 5" dbh and all trees marked with orange. 15 Acres.

ATV/Snowmobile trails must be kept in useable condition when open for public use. Any tops or slash dropped in trail must be promptly removed to prevent safety hazards to trail users.

No trucks or hauling west of landing area - trail is not safe for large trucks!

Purpose of Sale:

To thin a mixed white and red pine stand and to regenerate a mixed jack pine stand.

Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:

1. This sale is a mix of upland and lowland and will require dry or frozen conditions for access and operating. Some of the clearcut area is located on lower ground or is accessed across a drainage, but the thinning area is on high, dry ground.
2. No biomass harvesting may be done on this site, as the tops will be needed on skid trails to minimize damage to high-water table soils.
3. The sale boundaries are red paint lines, open marshes and a blue paint line. Do not fell trees or lay slash across the blue paint line. This is a private land boundary - do not trespass or cut blue painted trees.
4. Access into the sale will be using the ATV/Snowmobile trail. An open field on the north side of the trail may be used for a landing and truck turn-around. West of the landing, the trail may be used for forwarding only. Curves and deep ditches would not be safe for semi-truck traffic.
5. **ATV/Snowmobile trails must be kept in safe, useable condition when open for public use.**
6. All pine products cut between March 1 and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15.
7. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash.

General Requirements:

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. **Utilization:** cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
6. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
7. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
8. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.

10. **Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies – contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.**
