No bid bond required.

15% of the total sale bid value will be required as performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 215 acres.

The contract period is 31/2 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum top diameter chosen by the bidder will be cut and utilized.



Special Conditions:

1. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested. No machinery allowed within 50 feet of Long and Zottle Lakes. A 25 foot buffer must be maintained around all ephemeral ponds. No harvesting and skidding allowed between April 15 and July 15, in the oak area. In Zone A, all harvesting activities will be allowed from Sept. 1 to April 1 only.
2. Biomass harvesting is not allowed. Do not cut, knock down, or utilize dead trees unless the trees pose a safety hazard during harvesting operations.
3. Slash within 50 feet of the Town road must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and pulled back at least ten feet behind the tree line concurrent with cutting. No slash across any red line, in any wetland or within the powerline ROW.
4. Decking will be permitted along the snowmobile trails, as indicated on the map, in select areas only when an alternate decking site off the snowmobile trail is not possible. Snowmobile trail must be kept free of debris, snow covered in winter and left in good condition for vehicle traffic at all times. All trails must be repaired to pre-harvest conditions before the start of each snow season. All landings and any new woods roads must be approved prior to sale start-up.
5. All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year.

Long & Zottle Lakes are classified as Scenic Lakes

- Pine Area (21 Acres): Cut all aspen, white birch, maple, balsam fir and orange paint marked trees.
- Oak Area (90 Acres): Cut all merchantable tree species except hemlock, spruce, and all green paint marked trees. Cut only those pine marked with orange paint.
- Aesthetic Area (104 Acres): Cut all merchantable aspen, white birch, balsam fir and all orange paint marked trees. Do NOT cut orange "X" marked trees. No machinery allowed within 50 feet of Long and Zottle Lakes.

Note: Do NOT cut trees marked with green paint. Seasonal Restriction:
No activity permitted between April 15 - July 15, in Oak Area.
In ZONE A, all activities will be allowed from Sept. 1 - April 1 only.
