0:00	<p><b><u>E-Educate</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Background</u></b></p> <p>It is important to be familiar with the major parts and controls to assist proper maintenance and enhance the safety of the ATV riding experience.</p> <p>Before attempting to ride any ATV, you should read the owner's manual carefully and study the controls and their functions.</p> <p><b><u>D-Demonstrate</u></b></p> <p>Instructor will point out to the students the location and function of all the controls and common parts on the ATV:</p> <p><b><u>Brakes</u></b>-front, rear, foot and hand</p>	ATV

<p>10:00</p>	<p>Clutch-on manual shift models</p> <p>Choke-discuss different styles, possible locations and symbol</p> <p>Drive Systems-chain, drive shaft, 2-wheel, 4-wheel (AWD)</p> <p>Engine-different sizes, air, water, oil cooling methods</p> <p><u>Engine stop switch</u></p> <p>Footrests-different styles, protection offered</p> <p>Fuel shut -off valve-hand operated or automatic, possibly 3 positions</p> <p><u>Gear Selector</u>-automatic, semi-auto, electric, manual</p> <p>Ignition Switch-how it works</p> <p><u>Light Switch</u>-function, high/low beam</p> <p>Parking Brake-discuss different latching arrangements</p> <p>Start Switch/Pull Start-</p> <p>Spark Arrester Muffler-function of muffler and spark arrester</p> <p><u>Throttle Lever</u>-discuss location and how it controls engine speed</p>	
<p>20:00</p>	<p>*Students will observe instructor sit on the ATV and identify the location of the above underlined controls and name their functions. Instructor may use a blindfold, covered goggles or look straight ahead to perform this activity.</p> <p><u>O-Observe</u></p> <p>Select a <u>few</u> students to sit on the ATV and identify the location of the above underlined controls/locations. Use a blindfold or covered goggles to have students memorize the locations of the major controls (those underlined on the list above).</p> <p><u>C-Congratulate</u></p> <p>Congratulate students for their active participation in the exercise.</p>	<p>Blindfold or covered goggles</p>
