## Support local Friends groups!



In addition to all the spring cleaning, local Friends group members are busy getting ready for summer by cutting and stocking up on firewood. Many Friends groups sell firewood with proceeds going back to the park to be used for projects and other needs at their property.

The month of April brings warmer weather, Earth Day and Arbor Day. The Friends of Wisconsin State Parks celebrate this environmental month by hosting Work\*Play\*Earth Day events at properties around the state in partnership with local Friends groups and park staff. Work\*Play\*Earth Day events take place for several weekends in April and continue into early May.

Volunteers at these events help out the parks by cleaning up picnic and campground areas, planting trees, clearing park trails and removing invasive species such as garlic mustard. Friends groups typically provide lunches to say thanks to everyone who has volunteered for the day.

The Affinity Grants are given to Friends groups to support naturalist activities and programs. The grants help provide for some of the educational materials and other cool new things you'll see at the parks and nature centers this year.

May is also a popular time for school field trips. Friends members and volunteers help the parks by volunteering in the nature centers. They present programs and lead guided nature walks for school groups. They also assist park staff by greeting visitors and answering questions about the park's environment, give campfire talks and lead workshops and classes.

### What else is happening this month?

Spring is a time when many Friends groups and volunteers are out doing prairie restoration work. Friends members also assist with planting flower gardens at the parks and doing invasive plant removal.

Firewood and ice are also often sold by Friends groups with all of the proceeds staying at the property. If you're exploring the parks and need some equipment or supplies, make sure to stop by the park concessions.

Some of the most popular programs at the parks are nightly campfire talks, sing-alongs and visits by Smokey Bear. Friends members and volunteers help out the parks by bringing in singers and musicians, or by even performing themselves!

## Enjoy the parks!



## Thank you volunteers!





## Support local Friends groups!



Many of the new facilities at the parks are thanks to the work of the Friends groups and the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program which supports natural resource protection and nature-based outdoor recreation in Wisconsin. Friends groups raise money to come up with matching funds so they can apply for grants through the Stewardship Program that will aid in habitat restoration and the construction of recreational facilities.

Previous Friends projects include the construction of shelters, playground equipment, boardwalks, trails, accessible cabins and interpretive exhibits. The grants have also provided funding for invasive species removal, prairie and woodland restoration and pond reconstruction. Nov. 15 is the deadline for applying for Friends Stewardship grants.
