

**URBAN WILDLIFE DAMAGE ABATEMENT AND CONTROL 2020 GRANT AWARDS**

Urban Wildlife Damage Abatement and Control (UWDAC) grant funds are available to urban municipalities for a variety of cost-effective wildlife damage and control measures for White-tailed deer and Canada geese. Eligible urban communities can receive a 50% cost share grant up to a maximum grant award of \$5,000. Amount of State grant funds available for 2020: \$24,700.
