Marinette Marine Corporation d/b/a Fincantieri Marinette Marine (FMM) received the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' letter dated March 9, 2021 related to certain obligations associated with FMM's Building 34 and 35 at 1600 Ely Street, Marinette, WI. One item included in the March 9, 2021 letter is a request to submit a Site Investigation (SI) Work Plan by May 8, 2021.

As you are aware, this site is under active construction in the area where Buildings 34 and 35 are currently being built. As part of the construction process, soils are being excavated to facilitate the installation of the building foundations, subgrade utilities, and general regrades. This work is being conducted under an approved soil management plan requiring analytical soil testing throughout the process. Dewatering actions have also occurred to facilitate the excavating and constructing activities.

At this time, not all of the analytical results from the soil sampling conducted during beneficial reuse activities are available for review and analysis. Scoping of future SI work would benefit from a review of all available site analytical data and, as such, FMM requests that the submittal of the required SI Work Plan be delayed until that information is available and a review can be completed. We anticipate a delay of approximately 45 days.
