Lake Shore Systems, Inc. ("Lake Shore") received your letter in connection with the matter referenced above on or about July 28, 2019. We do understand the focus of your inquiry, but we do not have sufficient information to provide you with a response regarding the use or storage of PFAS compounds by either Lake Shore or prior owners or occupants of the property. Lake Shore acquired the assets at this location from Oldenburg Group Incorporated on September 30, 2016; the business was previously known as Lake Shore Inc. We fabricate and machine heavy machinery parts made mainly of steel and aluminum which is similar to the prior business. Manufacturing activities consist of the fabrication and machining of steel parts, through cutting, a plasma burn table, welding and machining.

As pertinent here in response to your inquiry, we are not aware of any past or present spills of any hazardous substances to environmental media, nor are we aware of any environmental investigation or remediation efforts that have occurred at this facility.
