While I am aware that it is generally not the department's role or responsibility to get involved in a municipality's relations with its community, I thought it would be appropriate to bring this matter to your attention, particularly since

- 1. the municipality is identified as a Responsible Party by the DNR for the site at hand
- 2. the DNR and DNR personnel were specifically invoked by Mr. Lindman when these inaccurate statements were made to the public and committee during a local government proceeding on January 6
- 3. and these matters impact confirmed Environmental Justice (EJ) populations in Wausau based on available income and minority data. In addition to other EJ principals which appear to have been violated in this instance, environmental justice defines "Fair Treatment" as people "having an opportunity to participate in decisions about activities that may affect their environment and/or health," according to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Clearly, if key documents such as work plans are intentionally withheld from public awareness and review, and inaccurate statements are made in regard to that withholding, there is no meaningful ability for citizens to participate in the described decisions and activities.
