Gun safety during our deer season is paramount to all hunters. With the increased interest in box blinds and ground blinds there arises a concern for safety. Because purchased blinds and/or homemade blinds are constructed with darkened windows and small slotted peep holes the safety colors of blaze orange and fluorescent pink are concealed from other surrounding hunters. Even though blinds can be elevated our Wisconsin topography can result in other hunters at the same level or on a hill higher than an occupied blind. Some blinds are positioned on the ground and most are camouflage.

Would you support that any obscuring or enclosed blind hang a minimum of one square foot of solid blaze orange or fluorescent pink material to be visible in all directions when the blind is occupied and removed after vacant?
