Wisconsin households, K-12 public schools and Parental Choice Program schools may recycle electronics through the E-Cycle Wisconsin program. The following electronics are accepted under E-Cycle Wisconsin. Many collection sites will also accept other items. DVD players, VCRs, DVRs and other video players
