

How to handle... **UNIVERSAL WASTE**

Recalled or Unused

PESTICIDES

TRAIN

Employees who handle universal waste require training, and the training should be documented.

CONTAINERIZE AND KEEP CLOSED

All waste pesticides must be kept in closed containers that will not leak or spill under normal conditions.

LABEL

All containers must be correctly labeled as "Universal Waste - Pesticides" or "Waste Pesticides" and have original product labels.

DATE

Individual items must be labeled with the date when the user decided the pesticide was waste.

REMOVE

Pesticides must be removed from the facility for recycling within one year of the date on the container.

If not managed as universal waste, recalled or unused pesticides must be managed as hazardous waste.

Waste pesticides include those that are cancelled, suspended, banned, recently purchased but unused and pesticide residue that remains in spray tanks.

Original product labels must be attached to containers of waste pesticides, even if the container you are storing the residue in is not the original container.


