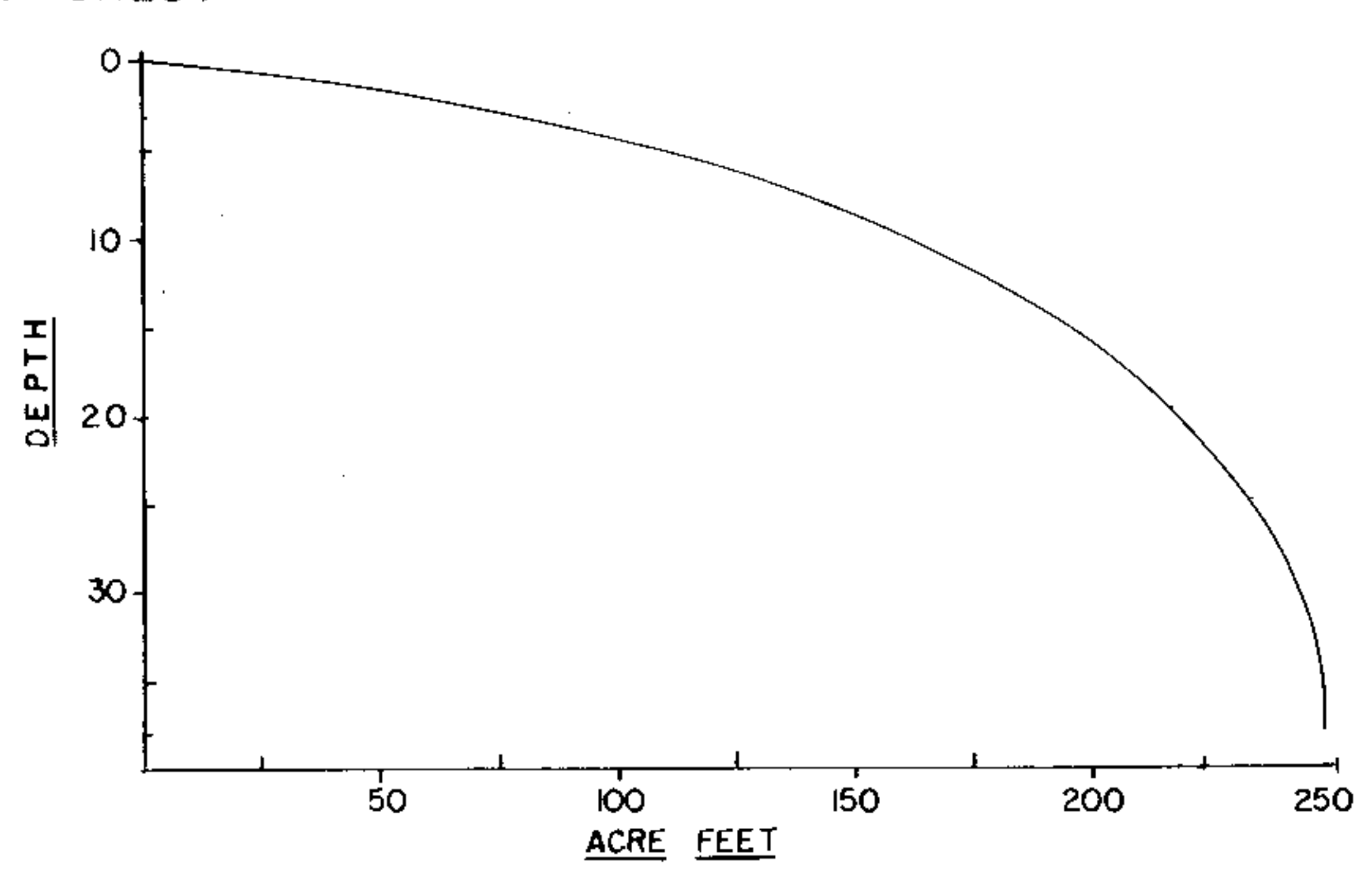


B.M. "X" is a railroad spike in the base of an 18 inch White Pine, located 57 feet north of the water's edge and 10 feet east of access road.
