Project Description Summary

As a result of the 2022 funded reroute of Trail 8 the Iron County Forestry Department proposes to construct a snowmobile trail for 1.06 miles adjacent to Island Lake Rd on County Forest property from the intersection of Trail 8 & Island Lake Rd to Snaketrack Rd. Snaketrack Rd is a County Forest Road which is only plowed when there are forestry operations in the area. As part of this project Snaketrack Rd would become a funded trail for 4.4 miles. This project would eliminate 1.36 miles of plowed route and .97 miles of trail 8 that runs under a power line, through some wetland and across several driveways. The net increase would be 4.49 miles.

This project will give the snowmobiler a much better experience as the north end of Snaketrack is often plowed by the Town of Knight to the shooting range. This project will eliminate that segment.

Trail Project Detailed Description

1.06 miles of trail will be constructed with tree removal, brushing with fecon mower, stumping with excavator and shaping the trail with the dozer. The trail will parallel Island Lake Road off of the ROW on County Forest property. Two culverts may be installed for drainage. This trail will be snowmobile only and native soil will be used for shaping.

Snaketrack Rd is a County Forest road and is only plowed when and where needed for logging operations. It connects with funded trail 77.

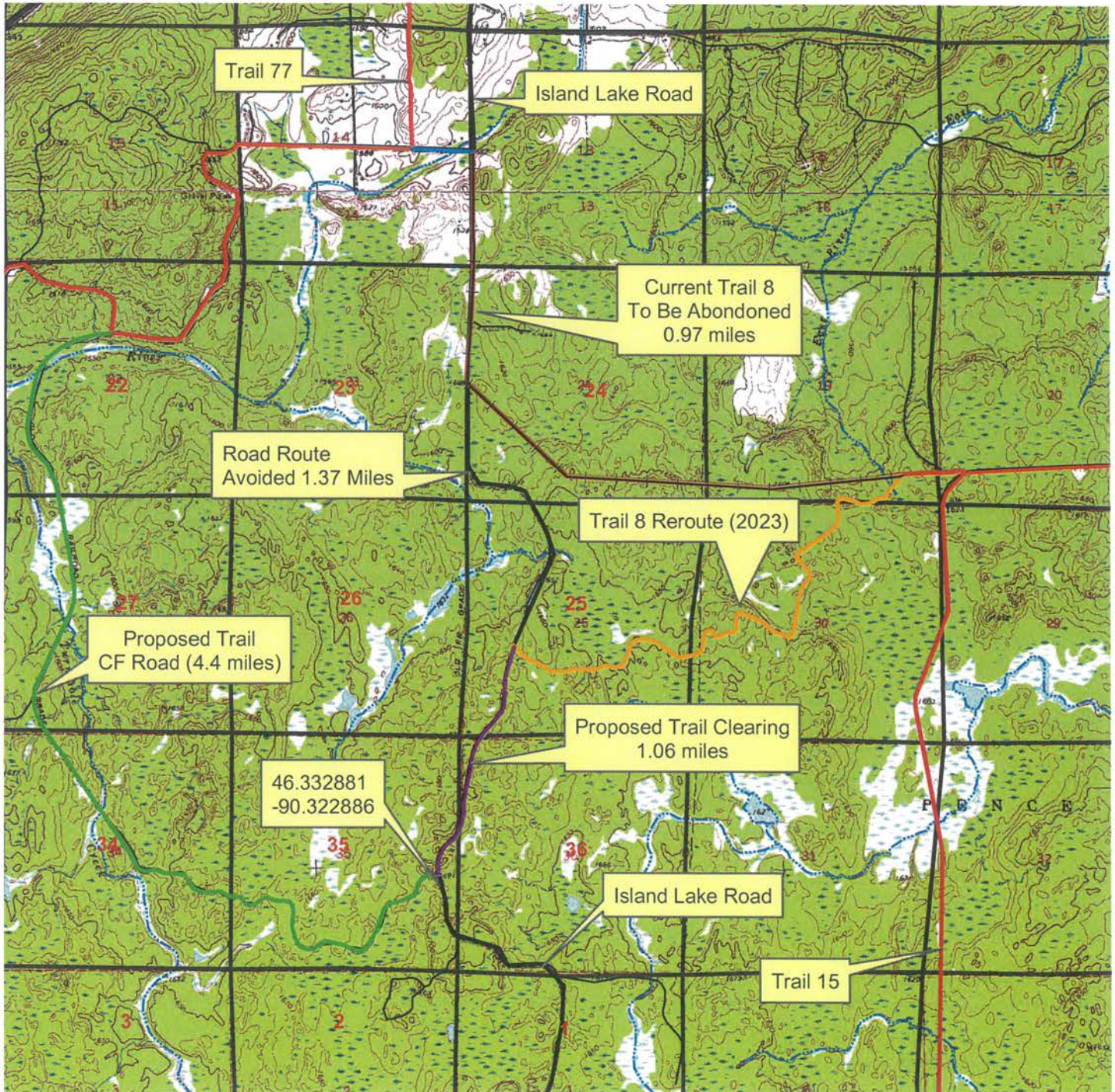

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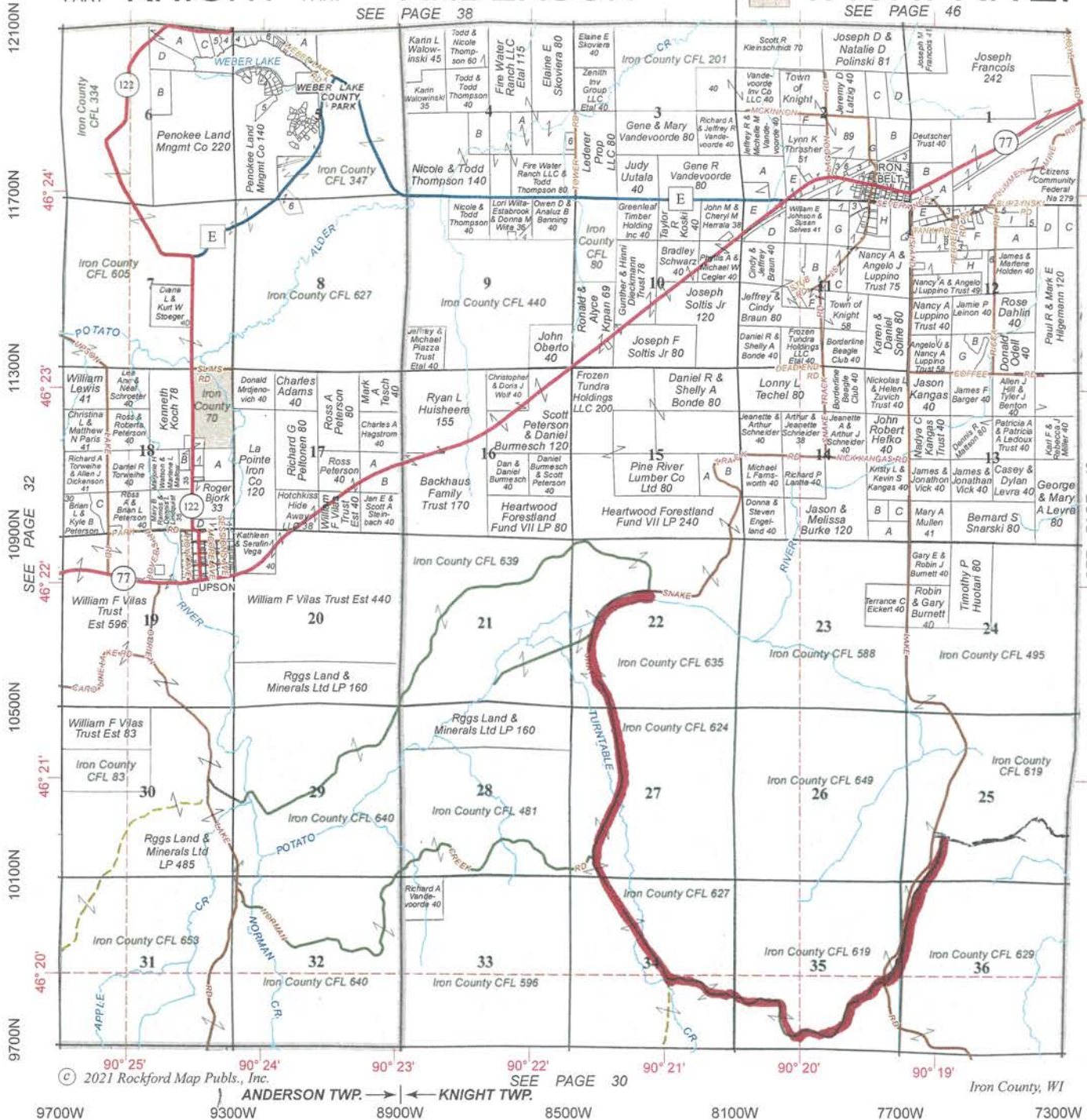
NORTH PART KNIGHT NORTHEAST PART ANDERSON

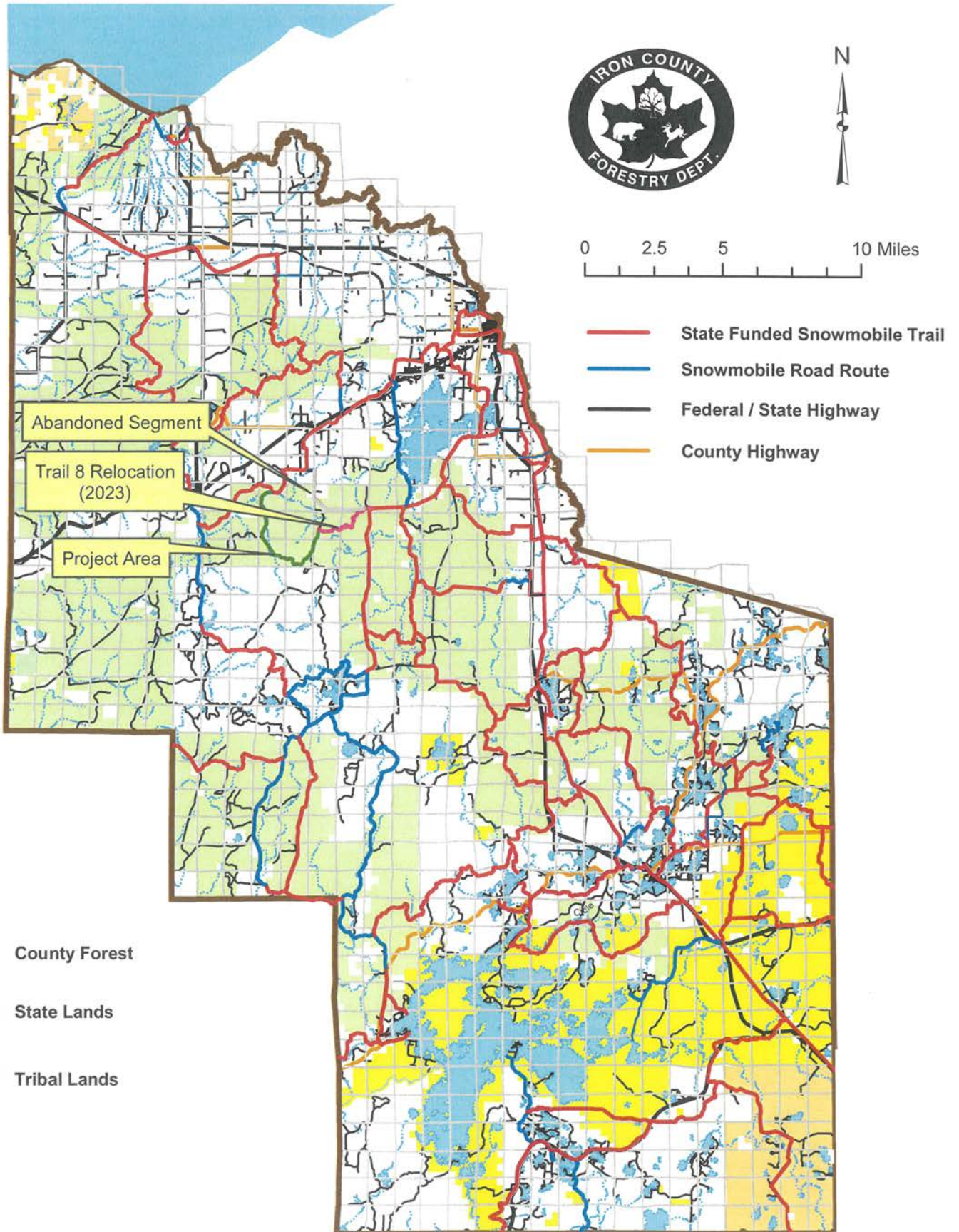

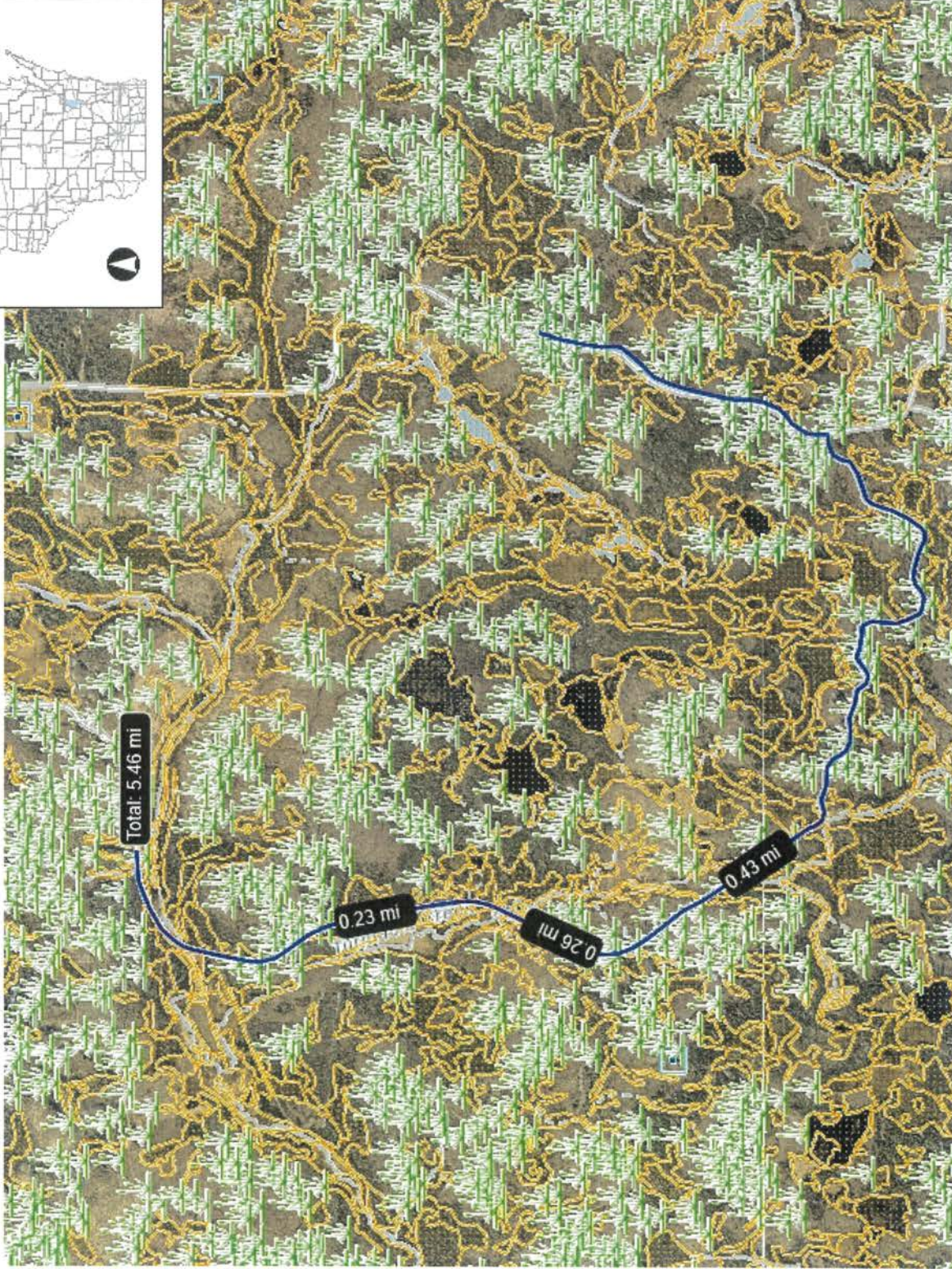

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS TO ADMINISTER THE IRON COUNTY FOREST FOR THE YEAR 2023

WHEREAS, Iron County is eligible to apply for various grants from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Department of Commerce, Department of Economic Development, Coastal Management Program and the Federal Government Section 154 Corps of Engineers authority; and

WHEREAS, the grant applications must include maps, designs, specifications, work plans, and financial estimates;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Iron County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Forest Administrator and County Clerk to submit applications to the above mentioned funding authorities for grants, including Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Grants for land acquisition, in aid to administer the Iron County Forest for the year, 2023, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Iron County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Iron County Forest Administrator to seek out and apply for any and all other grants in aid to administer the Iron County Forest as they become available and depending on the County's eligibility.
