# 6. DNR Funding Report

#### • Grants Report

- Snow Supplemental Seasonal History (past 10 years)
- Historically, the program has had a history of being oversubscribed (more requests than funds available). The trail pass program that came online in 2015 was brough more revenue into the program. We enjoyed four solid years of sufficient funding to get much further down the grant request list than we had in years. But we've gotten to the point where we're spending/committing more than we bring in, so any surplus we built up between 2015 and 2020 has been nearly depleted. We are bringing in \$12 million annually in revenue, but spending/awarding-grants of \$12.5 to \$13 million FY20-22, and \$15 million in FY23. After setting aside funding for maintenance and a 100% cost share of supplemental, we have \$2.6 million available for development projects, but \$4.7 million in requests.

#### 7. ACTION ITEM – Funding Amount Recommendation

Motion to recommend to the full Council we set aside \$200,000 for GPS unit leases for the 2023-24 season, \$2.4 for project funding. Motion by Mike and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sam. MOTION PASSED

• No easy answer on how much to set aside for emergencies or cost increases, especially when we have many bridge rehab projects to consider. Full Council can begin reviewing individual projects tomorrow, and at any point someone can propose to stop and save the remainder.

### 8. Committee member reports, comments and items

- Mike Holden Sno Council 1972 formed. First members included quite a few non-snowmo appointees including Sierra Club, UW Professor, Dept of Ag, etc.

• We should start the discussion on the possibility of raising registration fees or trail pass fees in the future. Wisconsin enjoys the largest funded trail network, the most registered vehicles, and some of the lowest user fees in North America. With the increased cost of equipment and bridges, more revenue may be needed to continue to support the trail system and clubs.
