All SFY 23 BIL EC eligible applicants are eligible for a 70% Principal Forgiveness rate, up to an annual cap of \$5,000,000 per municipality.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law mandates that at least 25% of BIL EC funding (principal forgiveness funding) is required to be awarded to disadvantaged communities. In SFY23, 93.1% of BIL EC funding is being awarded to disadvantaged communities.
