

 - Application is considered incomplete without correct phone number or email








- Ensure acceptable evidence of public notice is submitted with application.
 - Required for NR107 when acreage > 10.0 or 10% of the waterbody ≤ 10 ft in depth.
 - Most common cause of incomplete holds.
 - Acceptable evidence includes:
 - Signed affidavits with notice text included.
 - Picture of notice from the newspaper with newspaper name included.
 - Receipt of ad purchase with notice text, running dates, and newspaper name included.

- Ensure acceptable evidence of public notice is submitted with application.
 - Examples







Site Maps

- Site maps should use recent aerial imagery, accurately show the proposed control area(s), and correspond to area(s) listed on application. Should be able to easily tell what you're proposing.
- Use labels if there is more than one waterbody.
- If a waterbody's size/shape has completely changed, a new map is needed.
- Drawn-in polygons are not acceptable if imagery of the waterbody exists.

- Site Maps
 - Good Examples Recent imagery, clear labels that match permit, zoomed to correct ponds, inset map showing location.



ePermitting Updates 2023 – Question Clarification

- Clarification of Home Tab questions for determining permit type
 - Asking about the <u>waterbody</u>, not the control area.



ePermitting Updates 2023 – Required Fields

- Fields commonly left blank on forms are now required fields. Examples include:
 - Permit Form Business License Number
 - Treatment Record Herbicide Name and Amount Applied
- Should reduce confusion and reduce need for incomplete holds or follow up


ePermitting Updates 2023 – Lake Management Plan

- Updated section to be consistent with NR109 form questions
- Required for lakes
- Added section for attachment to be uploaded



ePermitting Updates 2023 – Whole Waterbody Concentration

- Updated section to include herbicide information and allow multiple products.
- Required for lakes.
- Instructions in ePermitting Guidebook.



ePermitting Updates 2023 – Mechanical Harvesting Renewal

- Option for renewing an existing harvesting permit
- Instructions outline when this is appropriate
- If you have questions, contact regional APM coordinator.

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Other Minor Updates

- Updated Riparian Owners section on NR109 form to match NR107 form
- Added fee limited option for payment section

Future Updates

- New forms for 2024
 - NR107 Wetland Permit Form
 - NR109 Reporting Form


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Survey Results - TR App
