BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

1. Bidding Procedure for Timber Sales
 - a. Bids will be made by species for each tract.
 - b. Estimated volumes and utilization specifications are listed on individual sale prospectus maps. Bid according to volumes listed on individual sale prospectus and/or maps.
 - c. The high bidder will be determined by the greatest total bid for each tract.
 - d. Bids will be opened in random order.
 - e. Bidders in attendance (virtual) can remove their bid from consideration before each individual tract is opened. Bidders must identify themselves by clearly stating their name, address, and telephone number PRIOR to a bid being opened to withdraw their bid from consideration.
2. Bids may be made on one or more tracts.
3. Submit each bid in an individual sealed envelope marked "Bid for Timber Stumpage" with the timber sale name, and tract number on the outside. Wisconsin DNR Timber Sale Bid Forms must be used to make bids on DNR timber sales and is included with the individual sale prospectus
4. A per unit bid must be made on every item on a tract. No "zero" bids for any species or products will be accepted.

5. Winning bidders will be notified within 24 hours of bid opening and must sign the timber sale contract and submit an acceptable performance bond within 6 weeks of the bid opening. If the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state or GNA timber sales for a two-year period.
6. A Performance Bond or Letter of Credit is required before awarding of contract. The bond shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid value or a minimum of \$1000.00, whichever is greater. The bond will be held intact by the Department of Natural Resources until the satisfactory completion of the timber sale contract. Performance bonds in a form of other than cash for these sales must expire no earlier than 1-year past contract expiration date.
7. The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

SALES TAX CERTIFICATION

1. A Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate must be provided at the signing of the contract. This certificate is required to cover a contractor or individual reselling stumpage harvested for firewood/fuelwood and mills and manufacturing facilities. UTILIZATION

1. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a minimum of 4" for pulp and 10.6" dib for logs unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.
2. When designated for cutting, all trees containing one (1) or more one hundred inch (100") long stick to a four inch (4") minimum top diameter will be considered merchantable.

2. See individual timber sales for utilization specifications

SCALING AND PAYMENT

1. If eligible for deferred payment option, payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after invoice.
2. If not eligible for deferred payment option, no wood will be hauled from the sale area until advanced payment is made.
3. If sold as a lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by the cutting block, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.
4. The mill scale ticket system will be used as the preferred method of sale administration. Other scaling systems may be used at the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources.

5. If a woods scale system is used, all cordwood or logs will be piled for scaling. Piles will be level and square with at least 10 cords per pile or 5 MBF. At least 10 cords or 5 MBF will be piled before a scale is requested. Scaling requests must be made at least one day in advance.
6. No refunds of stumpage payments will be made for un-removed wood, and wood left on the sale area at contract expiration shall revert to the seller.
7. Scribner Decimal C Log Rule shall be used for scaling logs. Conversion from MBF to cords or cords to MBF shall be 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods and 2.2 cords per MBF for hardwoods.
8. Weight scale conversions will be at rates as specified in the Department of Natural Resources timber sale handbook listed below, unless the individual timber sale has specific mixed species pro-rates/conversions.
9. Any firewood sold to a private party must either be stick-scaled by DNR prior to leaving the timber sale, or it must be sold via a triplicate ticket system. If the ticket system is used, the logger, private party, and DNR must receive a copy of each ticket.

CONTRACT PERIOD

1. **All contracts offered during this bid opening are three (3) year contracts and will expire June 30th, 2026.**

CONTRACT EXTENSIONS

Contract extensions will not be granted without justifiable reason. Justification will be determined by the Department of Natural Resources. All contracts are for three (3) years and will expire June 30th, 2026. Contract extensions are not guaranteed. No more than one contract extension will be considered per sale and if granted, will be for one (1) year and will incur a 15% increase in stumpage.

OTHER CONDITIONS

1. Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Water Quality, Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidelines, and Best Management Practices for Invasive Species must be followed on all DNR timber sales. More information on these management guidelines can be found at the links found below.

2. HRD/OAK WILT REQUIREMENTS

- a. Oak Wilt Restrictions: No Cutting/Skidding in stands managed for oak will be permitted from April 1-July 15 unless otherwise noted in prospectus. Restricted dates may vary based on current Oak Harvesting Guidelines.
 - b. Heterobasidion root disease (Annosum root rot) Prevention Treatment: Unless otherwise stated on the individual prospectus, all sales requiring the cutting of conifers will also require the Purchaser to complete heterobasidion root disease (Annosum root rot) preventative treatment from April 1-November 30, or under unusually warm weather between December 1 and March 31. Treatment involves chemically treating all fresh-cut stumps or significant wounds on conifers of merchantable size by applying CELLU-TREAT (disodium octaborate tetrahydrate) or Rotstop C (P gigantea), unless stated otherwise on the individual sale prospectus. Treatment shall be made within 24 hours of cutting and a dye product shall be added to liquid solutions for inspection purposes. Unless treated immediately after cutting and before the next tree is cut, ALL stumps shall remain clear of slash for application and administration purposes.
 - c. The application of chemicals will be conducted by a Certified Pesticide Applicator.
3. Best Management Practice considerations on each property may restrict where equipment can operate. See each individual prospectus for more information.

4. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.

The “Contractor” (purchaser) shall provide the Department of Natural Resources with a Certificate of Insurance counter-signed by a Wisconsin Resident Agent, indicating that Worker’s Compensation Insurance coverage is provided for the duration of the contract prior to any performance under it. Contractor claiming exemption, independent status, the contractor/purchaser will be required to submit a signed, notarized affidavit that affirms their exempt status pursuant to the criteria listed in section 102.07(7)(b), of the Wisconsin Statutes.

5. Contract may contain other provisions. Contracts may not be assigned. A sample copy of the contract is available upon request.

7. *TRAINING STANDARD*****

The Purchaser shall ensure that at least one in-woods person actively engaged in performance of this contract and responsible for the logging site complies with the Wisconsin Sustainable Forestry Initiative® (SFI®) Training Standard as adopted by the Wisconsin SFI Implementation Committee (SIC). Criteria for the standard can be found at the website https://www.fistausa.org/fista/SFI_Workshops.asp or by contacting the Forest Industry Safety & Training Alliance (FISTA). Purchaser agrees to provide documentation to Seller that the training has been attained prior to initiating sale.

****Purple Line****- Differentiates between cutting units when cutting units are side by side.

Unit 1- (58ac) Within the red and blue paint lines, harvest all trees marked on the stem and stump with orange paint. In addition, all aspen and ash are designated for harvest.

Unit 2- (11ac) Within the red paint lines, cut all trees 1.0” dbh and larger, *except do not cut any white oaks or trees marked with green paint.*

Operational Considerations-

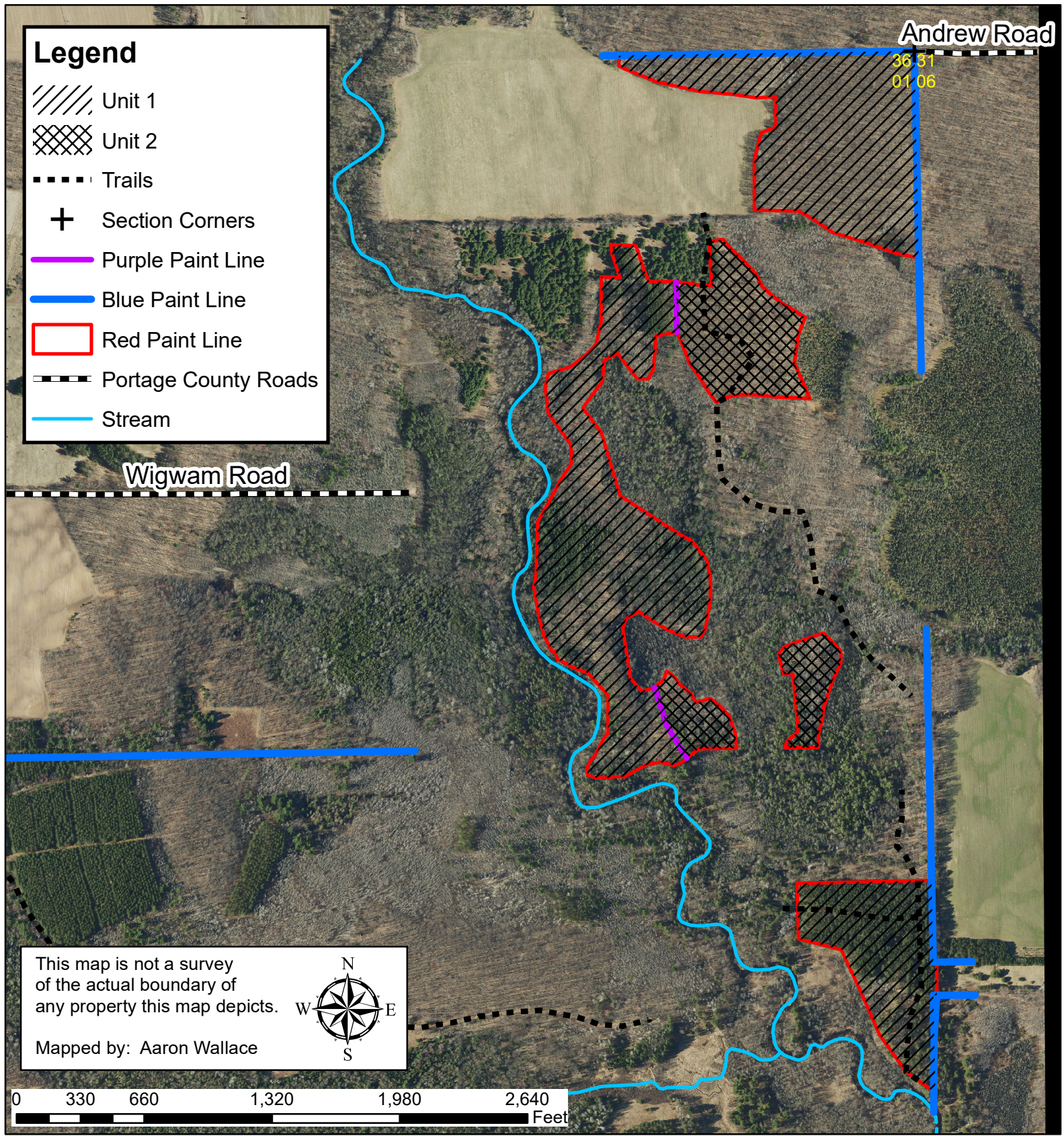
- Due to the occurrence of oak wilt, all harvesting activities are prohibited in areas managed for oak from April 1 to July 15th. These dates may be adjusted by the timber sale administrator.
- All cut conifer products must be removed from the sale area within two weeks after being cut between May 1 and September 15.
- No harvesting during the traditional nine day deer gun season.
- Heterobasidion Root Disease (HRD) – The Purchaser shall purchase and apply an approved fungicide (Rotstop C or Cellu-Treat) to all cut pine stumps and horizontal wound surfaces as is noted in the timber sale contract.
- Pre-harvest meeting on site prior to any snowfall and prior to any equipment moving in. No equipment allowed on site prior to discussion/meeting with timber sale administrator on such matter. **No exceptions.**

- The contractor must contact the timber sale administrator a minimum of one week prior to starting a sale contract.
- Off-road logging equipment shall be free of concentrations of plant material and soil prior to entering the sale area. The Purchaser will contact the Seller 48 hours prior to delivering equipment to the sale area to arrange for on-site inspection. No equipment dropped off without 48hr notice to DNR Forester.
- Access is off Andrews Rd.
- The locations, building, and maintenance of new landings, roads, and accesses are the full responsibility of the purchaser and are always subject to advance approval and under the conditions of the timber sale administrator who must be contacted at least 48 hours prior to construction of a landing, road, or access.
- All existing trails, roads, and clearings used for logging operations must be restored to pre-sale conditions by the purchaser.
- Roads and landings shall be graded and leveled or closed out to the satisfaction of the Seller upon completion of timber sales. Any accesses developed across ditches or other drainage features will be restored to their original condition.
- Existing skid trails must be kept free of debris and ruts. They must be left in good condition for vehicle traffic at all times. All trails must be repaired to pre-harvest conditions during mid-contract “pull-off” or end of sale.
- Rutting will be monitored and if soil disturbances become excessive (based on established thresholds defined in contract), harvesting operations may be suspended until the affected areas are repaired properly.
- No full tree length skidding will be allowed. All products to be removed on a forwarder, no ground skidding will be allowed. All cut stringers must be utilized.
- Standing snags are to be retained uncut - except they may be felled and left in the woods if they are a safety hazard.
- No woodpiles may be left on the landing for more than 30 days without advance approval of the Seller.
- Follow Wisconsin BMP’s for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. Some areas of this sale will likely require frozen ground conditions due to access across wetlands. WI DNR may have some timber mats available to use.
- Mixed Hardwood consists of ash, basswood, cherry, ironwood, red maple, sugar maple, white and yellow birches.
- **No boltwood category.** All products 10.6” dib on the small end and 50% sound will be counted as sawtimber, regardless of grade. DNR reserves the right to scale and invoice for all sawtimber products using the Scribner Decimal C rule, prior to leaving the landing.

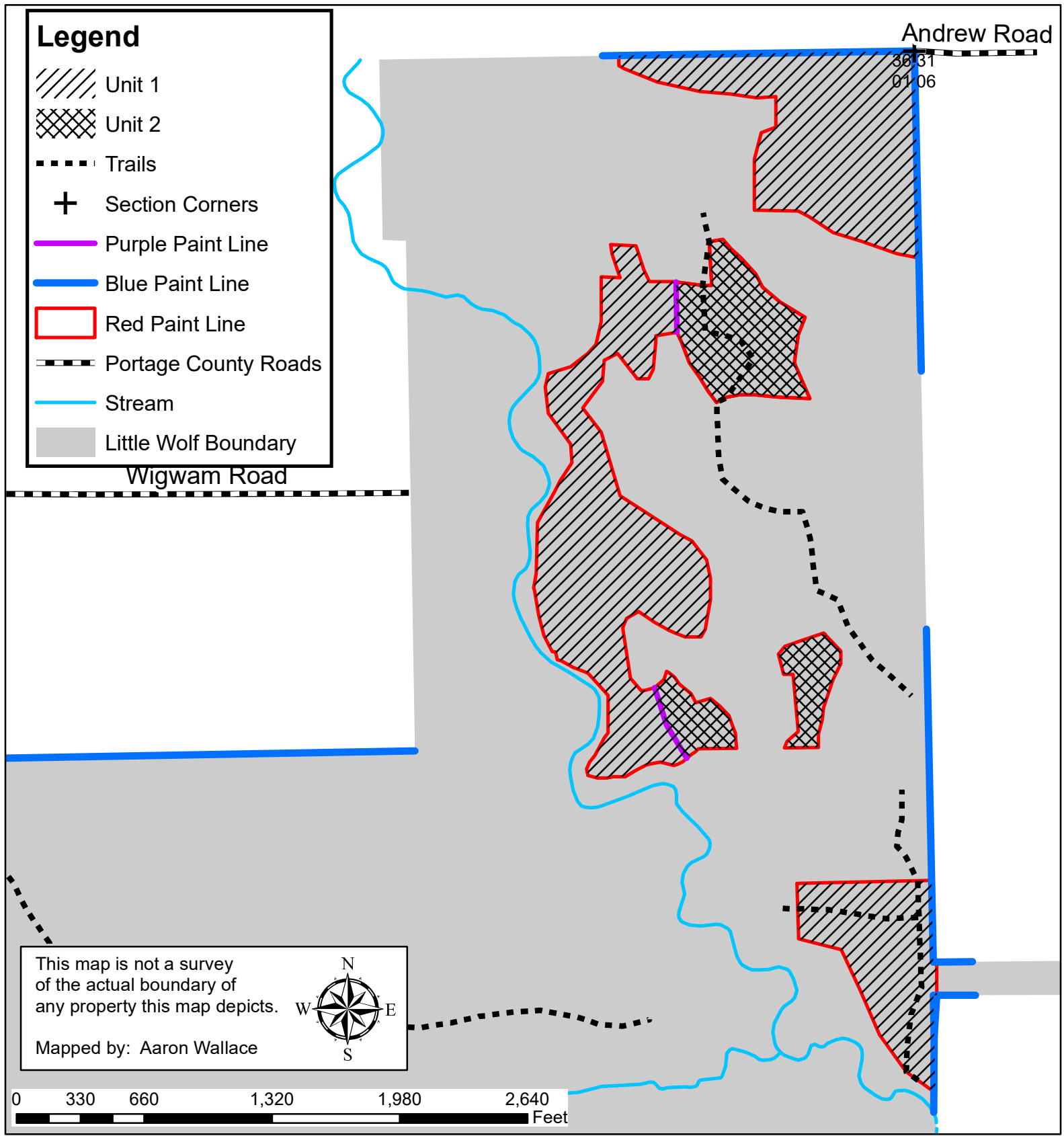

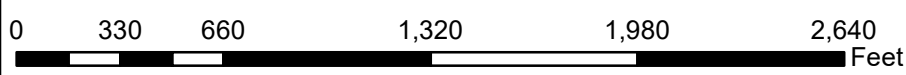

- Off-road logging equipment shall be free of concentrations of plant material and soil prior to entering the sale area. The Purchaser will contact the Seller 48 hours prior to delivering equipment to the sale area to arrange for on-site inspection. No equipment dropped off without 48hr notice to DNR Forester.
- Access is off 1st Ave, ST HWY 22 &/or through private landowner with access secured by timber sale contractor.
- The locations, building, and maintenance of new landings, roads, and accesses are the full responsibility of the purchaser and are always subject to advance approval and under the conditions of the timber sale administrator who must be contacted at least 48 hours prior to construction of a landing, road, or access.
- All existing trails, roads, and clearings used for logging operations must be restored to pre-sale conditions by the purchaser.
- Roads and landings shall be graded and leveled or closed out to the satisfaction of the Seller upon completion of timber sales. Any accesses developed across ditches or other drainage features will be restored to their original condition.
- Existing skid trails must be kept free of debris and ruts. They must be left in good condition for vehicle traffic at all times. All trails must be repaired to pre-harvest conditions during mid-contract “pull-off” or end of sale.
- Rutting will be monitored and if soil disturbances become excessive (based on established thresholds defined in contract), harvesting operations may be suspended until the affected areas are repaired properly.
- No full tree length skidding will be allowed. All products to be removed on a forwarder, no ground skidding will be allowed. All cut stringers must be utilized.
- Standing snags are to be retained uncut - except they may be felled and left in the woods if they are a safety hazard.
- No woodpiles may be left on the landing for more than 30 days without advance approval of the Seller.
- Follow Wisconsin BMP’s for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. Some areas of this sale will likely require frozen ground conditions due to access across wetlands. WI DNR may have some timber mats available to use.
- Mixed Hardwood consists of ash, basswood, cherry, ironwood, red maple, sugar maple, white and yellow birches.
- **No boltwood category.** All products 10.6” dib on the small end and 50% sound will be counted as sawtimber, regardless of grade. DNR reserves the right to scale and invoice for all sawtimber products using the Scribner Decimal C rule, prior to leaving the landing.

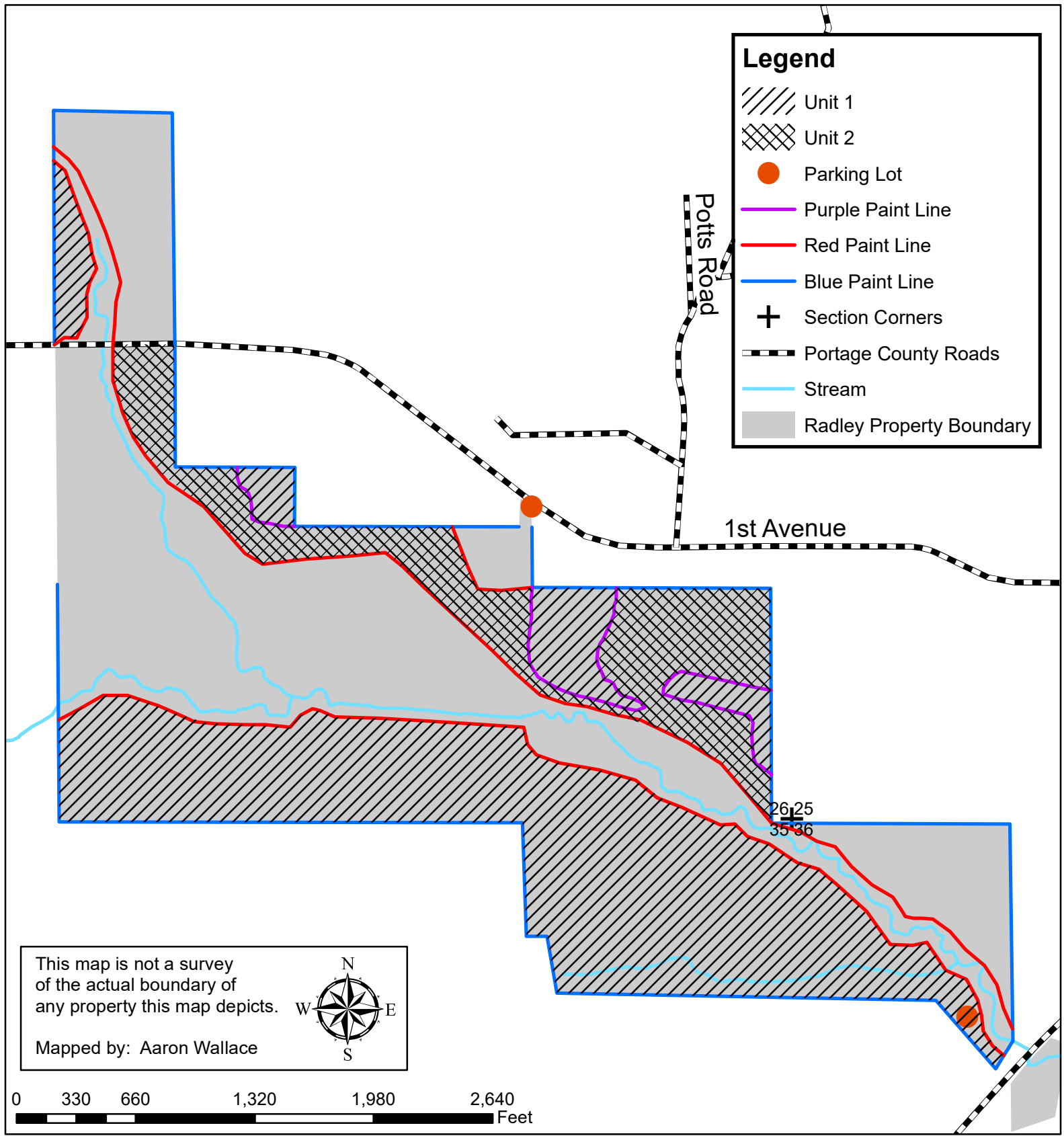
