

### What is the Great Lakes Compact?

- Agreement between Great Lake states and provinces to collectively manage water quantity in the Great Lakes
  - Implements parallel water management programs in Great Lakes states and provinces
  - Promotes water conservation and efficiency
  - Prohibits diversions, with some limited exceptions
  - Recognizes that the waters of the Great Lakes can serve multiple purposes.



# What requirements must the Racine application meet?

Wisconsin and Great Lakes Compact requirements specified for a diversion approval	Applies to Racine Application
Application must be from a public water supply system	Yes
Diversion for public water supply purposes	Yes
All water returned less an allowance for consumptive use	Yes
The water will be treated to meet applicable permit requirements and to prevent the introduction of invasive species to the Great Lakes basin	Yes
Maximizes Great Lakes water returned to the Great Lakes basin and minimizes out of basin water returned	Yes
Requires a water conservation plan	Yes
Requires a water supply service area plan	No**
Proposal meets Great Lakes Compact exception standard	No**

Does the application meet the Great Lakes Compact diversion criteria?




#### Applicant: City of Racine Straddling Community: Village of Mount Pleasant



Applicant – "A person may apply ...for approval of a new ...diversion...only if the person operates a public water supply system that receives or would receive water from the new...diversion." (281.346 (4)(b)2.)

### Racine Diversion – Water Balance


