



# How to Use the Well Driller Viewer

1) Zoom into the location where you plan to drill the well using any of the following methods:

- Double click on the map directly OR
- Click the blue “Search By” button to zoom into a:
  - o County
  - o Township, Range and Section
  - o Latitude and longitude
  - o City, town or village
- Choose the Zoom In + tool bar button and draw a box OR
- Move the cursor and scroll the mouse wheel OR
- Use your fingers to zoom in on a tablet or phone

**Welcome to the Well Driller Viewer**

The Well Driller Viewer provides a visual map view of specific setback, construction and approval information to assist well drillers in planning projects and meeting requirements of NR 812, Wis. Adm. Code.

- Zoom in to your specific location of interest by any of the following methods:
  - Double-click on the map OR
  - Click on the blue Search By button OR
  - Choose the Zoom In+ tool bar button and draw a box OR
  - Zoom in with your fingers on a tablet or phone.
- Learn about potential issues such as nearby landfills, remediation sites, dual aquifer or special casing areas. Read the results that pop-up in the middle of the screen to understand construction requirements, and click on links to get application forms or more information.

2) Click the “Identify” tool then click on the location where you plan to construct the well.

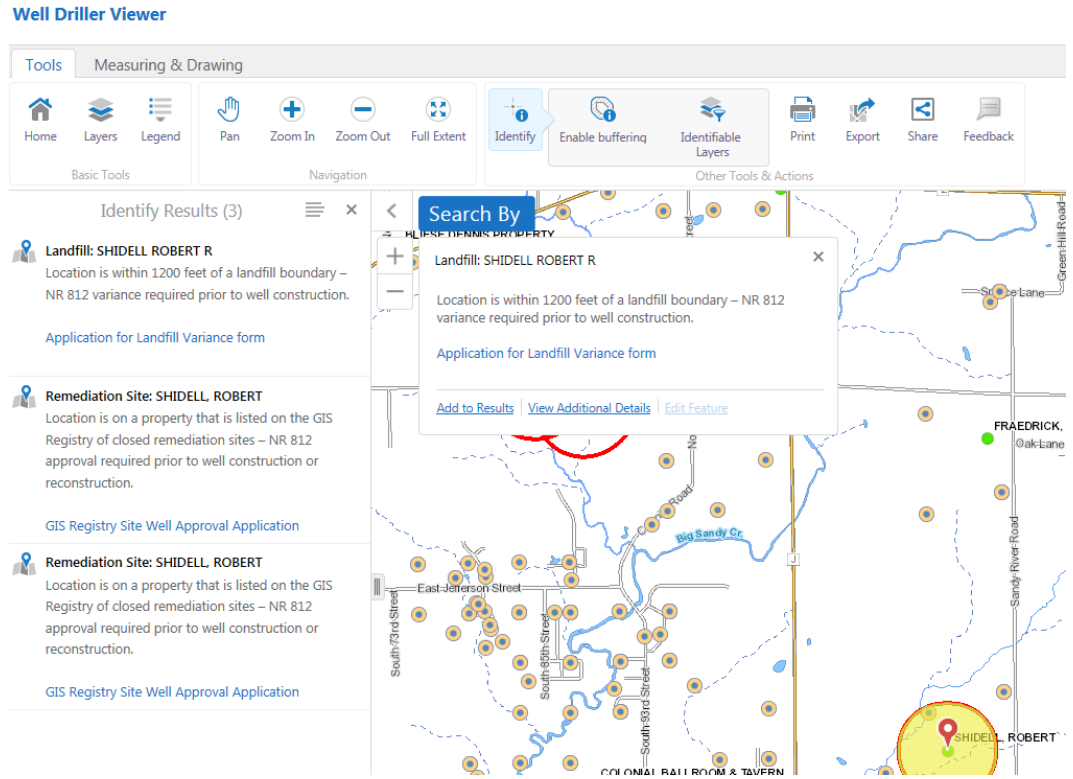


## Tip:

3) Potential issues will appear on the left, under “Identify Results”. For each issue, read the implications. If you are in doubt, contact your DNR Private Water Specialist.

4) Well construction reports from 1988-present are available for private wells. Zoom in close (1:50,000) until the brown circles appear. Click the Identify tool and click on a dot. A link to the well construction report will appear.
