

TOWN OF HAYWARD

A SOLE ORDINANCE TO REGULATE BOATING UPON THE WATERS OF ROUND LAKE AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

The Town of Hayward Board of the County of Sawyer do ordain as follows:

Section I Applicability and Enforcement

- (a) The provisions of this ordinance shall apply to the waters of Round Lake.
- (b) This chapter shall be enforced by the officers of the County of Sawyer, and Township of Hayward.

Section II Intent

The intent of this ordinance is to provide safe and healthful conditions for the enjoyment of aquatic recreation consistent with public rights and interests, and the capability of the water resources.

Section III State Boating and Safety Laws Adopted

State boating laws as found in ss. 30.50 to 30.71, Wisconsin Statutes, are adopted by reference.

Section IV Definitions

- (a) "Slow-No-Wake" means that speed at which a boat moves as slowly as possible while still maintaining steering control.

Section V Controlled Area

No person shall operate a boat faster than slow-no-wake in the waters of Round Lake within 100 feet of or between buoys placed by GPS coordinates in the following locations:

Section VI Posting Requirements

The Township of Hayward shall place and maintain a synopsis of this ordinance at all public access points within the jurisdiction of the Township of Hayward pursuant to the requirements of NR 5.15 Wisconsin Administrative Code.

Section VII Penalties

Wisconsin state boating penalties as found in Wisconsin Statute 30.80 and deposits as established in the Uniform Deposit and Bail Schedule established by the Wisconsin Judicial Conference, are hereby adopted by reference and all references to fines amended to forfeitures and all references to imprisonment deleted.


Section VIII Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and is expressly declared that the Town Board would have passed the provisions of the ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provisions of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

Section IX Effective Date

This section will become effective upon passage and the day after publication.


