

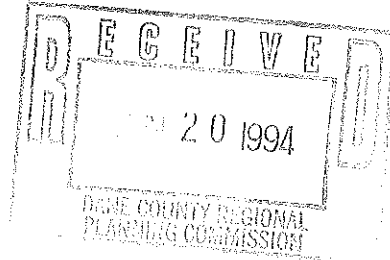

SUBJECT: Village of Cross Plains Urban Service Area amendment -
14.3 acres in the northeast area of the Village.

Dear Mr. Lane:

We have reviewed the Sewer Service Area (SSA) amendment requested for the proposed 14.3 acre residential development in the northeast area of the Village of Cross Plains and we are conditionally approving the amendment.

Black Earth Creek was previously designated as a priority watershed under the Wisconsin Nonpoint Source Pollution Abatement Program and the watershed plan was formally adopted in 1989. As a priority watershed we feel it's particularly important to minimize adverse impacts on the Creek by focusing on practical pollutant abatement measures.

This SSA amendment approval requires that the following conditions will be satisfied within 60 days of the date of this letter.

- 1.) We have received a construction site erosion control plan for the residential subdivision .
- 2.) We have received a stormwater management plan for the residential subdivision.

Assuming development compatible to the protection of the environment including proper site development, and construction, and soil erosion control practices, there should be no significant adverse water quality impacts attributable to the development of the planned sanitary sewer service area.

Please note that the approval of this revision does not constitute approval of a private sewage system for a holding tank pursuant to Chapter IHLR 83, or sewer extension pursuant to Chapter NR 110, Wisconsin Administrative Code. Those approvals must be obtained separately from the respective agencies.

If any person is aggrieved by this approval, that person has the right to appeal the decision. Wisconsin Statutes and Administrative Code establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to s. 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., a petition for review must be filed within 30 days after service of the decision. The respondent in an action for judicial review is the Department of Natural Resources. This notice is provided pursuant to s. 227.48(2), Wis. Stats.
