Mr. Tom Goetz and Mr. Harold Lee said the original owner of this property, Mr. Chauncey Bottom, named two lakes after his two daughters. Thus we have Claire Lake and Nancy Lake. Either form would probably be acceptable.

The following names listed on the Wisconsin portion of your Docket 163 have been checked for accuracy of description and have been found to be correct to the best of my knowledge:

- Dead Creek Spring, Sawyer County
- East Eightmile Lake, Bayfield County
- Evelyn Lake, Sawyer County
- Nancy Lake, Bayfield County
- West Eightmile Lake, Bayfield County

The above names were approved by the State Geographic Names Council. Other actions taken by the Council at their meeting held on April 3, 1972, concerning items listed on Docket 163 are as follows:

Rust Flowage, Bayfield County

A map study was conducted by the Council on this matter. Due to the name Mill Pond Lake being so well established on maps and publications the Council denied Rust Flowage and approved Mill Pond Lake.

Lake Twentyfive, Sawyer County

It was agreed by the State Council that this description should not be designated as a separate feature from Nelson Lake; therefore, the proposal was denied and Nelson Lake was retained.

The Bayfield County Board on June 6, 1972, approved the above indicated names for features located in Bayfield County. We have not received as yet such approval from the Sawyer County Board for names in Sawyer County.
